

2010 Senate Bills – Related

- SB 11 – Appel **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** A Constitutional Amendment to provide for forfeiture of retirement benefits by public officials and employees who are convicted of felony acts associated with their positions.
- SB 12 – Appel **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** Requires forfeiture of retirement benefits by any public employee or elected official who is a member of a public retirement system and is convicted of certain state or federal felony acts associated with his office.
- SB 13 – B.Gautreaux **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** Allows garnishment of Louisiana public retirement or pension system, plan, or fund benefits of an elected official to pay fines or restitution imposed for a felony associated with his office.
- SB 14 – Appel **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** Provides relative to the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System (LASERS) and allows for a change in beneficiary for purposes of joint and survivor annuities.(7/1/10)
- SB 58 – B.Gautreaux **RETIREMENT CREDIT:** Allows members of the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System to purchase service credit for purposes of retirement eligibility. (7/1/10)
- SB 62 – Crowe **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** Provides for a change of beneficiary under certain circumstances.
- SB 82 – ElbertGuillory **REGISTRARS OF VOTERS:** Establishes an additional state employee position in the office of the registrar in St. Landry Parish. (8/15/10)
- SB 95 – Morrish **ELECTED OFFICIALS:** Constitutional amendment to abolish the offices of lieutenant governor and state treasurer. (2/3-CA13s1(A))
- SB 134 – B.Gautreaux **RETIREMENT SYSTEMS:** Provides relative to the Public Retirement Systems' Actuarial Committee. (7/1/10)
- SB 191 – B.Gautreaux **RETIREMENT SYSTEMS:** Provides relative to compliance with applicable federal tax qualification requirements for Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana, Louisiana School Employees' Retirement System, and State Police Pension and Retirement System. (7/1/10)
- SB 300 – Donahue **STATE AGENCIES:** Provides that state agencies, including higher education and state public hospitals, explore the adoption of "lean" principles. (gov sig)
- SB 404 – Donahue **STATE AGENCIES:** Provides for the establishment of regional governmental service centers for the delivery of state services under a "mall concept." (8/15/10)
- SB 571 – Donahue **STATE AGENCIES:** Transfers enforcement of stationary weights and standards stations from Department of Transportation and Development to Department of Public Safety and Corrections. (7/1/10)
- SB 594 – B.Gautreaux **RETIREMENT SYSTEMS:** Relative to public retirement systems, provides relative to investments. (7/1/10)

- SB 602 – B.Gautreaux **RETIREMENT SYSTEMS:** Relative to Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System, Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana, and Louisiana School Employees' Retirement System, places restrictions on participation in the Deferred Retirement Option Plan. (7/1/10)
- SB 603 – Morrish **STATE TREASURER:** Transfers the powers and duties of the state treasurer and the Department of Treasury. (See Act)
- SB 627 – Lafleur **MUSEUMS:** Transfers museums from the secretary of state to the lieutenant governor. (1/1/11)
- SB 632 – B.Gautreaux **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** Provides a regular schedule for permanent benefit increases for retirees of the state retirement systems. (06/30/10)

2010 Senate Bills – Direct CS Reference

- SB 289 – Donohue **CIVIL SERVICE DEPARTMENT:** Requires that the department annually report the employee turnover rate to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.
- SB 290 – Donahue **CIVIL SERVICE DEPARTMENT:** Requires that the department annually report the employee turnover rate to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.
- SB 293 – Donahue **STATE AGENCIES:** Requires annual internal review by each agency of employee vacancies and attrition rates with strategic reductions in positions by five percent, with reports to Commission on Streamlining Government. (8/15/10)
- SB 426 – Donahue **STATE EMPLOYEES:** Requires all executive branch agencies, including higher education entities, to report all employees to the Department of State Civil Service and the legislature.
- SB 519 – Walsworth **STATE EMPLOYEES:** Provides that GOHSEP employees are unclassified. (see Act)
- SB 560 – Donahue **STATE AGENCIES:** Requires all state boards and commissions in the executive branch to file annually with the commissioner of administration, the speaker of the House, and the president of the Senate, a financial statement, and requires that all revenues received by such board or commission that are surplus be subject to appropriation for any lawful purpose. (8/15/10)

2010 House Bills – Related Bills

- HB 71 – Labruzzo **RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS:** Relative to the La. State Employees' Retirement System (LASERS), allows for an increased benefit for members and retirees affected by Hurricane Katrina or Rita who took early retirement
- HB 72 – Labruzzo **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** Prohibits a public servant convicted of an office-related felony from receiving retirement benefits
- HB 73 – Ligi **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** Requires forfeiture of retirement benefits by any public employee or elected official who is a member of a public retirement system and is convicted of certain state or federal felony acts associated with his office
- HB 99 – Jones **ETHICS/BOARD:** Provides with respect to the nomination and selection of members of the Board of Ethics
- HB 143 – Labruzzo **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for forfeiture of public retirement benefits by certain persons who are convicted of felony acts associated with their positions
- HB 189 – Richard **RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS:** Provides for early retirement of LASERS members with actuarial reduction of benefits; requires abolition of positions vacated by early retirement and permits reestablishment and filling of such positions under limited circumstances
- HB 224 – Pearson **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** Requires suspension of public retirement benefits during incarceration
- HB 225 – Labruzzo **RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS:** Relative to the La. State Employees' Retirement System (LASERS), allows a retiree to designate a trust as beneficiary of retirement benefits
- HB 226 – Hardy **RETIREMENT/TEACHERS:** Relative to the Teachers' Retirement System of La., provides relative to rehired retirees
- HB 227 – Pearson **RETIREMENT/TEACHERS:** Relative to the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana, provides relative to rehired retirees
- HB 228 – Pearson **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for suspension of public retirement benefits during a member's incarceration
- HB 229 – Pearson **RETIREMENT/PUBLIC SYSTEM:** (Constitutional Amendment) Relative to public retirement systems, requires a 2/3 vote to enact any changes to retirement provisions having an actuarial cost
- HB 230 – Pearson **RETIREMENT/STATE SYSTEMS:** Relative to La. School Employees' Retirement System (LSERS), makes changes to provisions relating to employee contributions, benefit calculation, and retirement eligibility
- HB 231 – Monica **RETIREMENT/CLERKS COURT:** Relative to the Clerks' of Court Retirement and Relief Fund, provides for retirement with 30 years of service at any age
- HB 240 – Danahay **ETHICS/BOARD:** Provides relative to enforcement of laws within the jurisdiction of the Board of Ethics

HB 272 – Carter **INSURANCE/GROUP-STATE:** Provides for certain health insurance options related to the insured's lifestyle with respect to tobacco use and weight

HB 329 – Pearson **RETIREMENT/PUBLIC OFFLS:** (Constitutional Amendment) Prohibits membership of certain part-time public officials in public retirement systems

HB 330 – Pearson **RETIREMENT/PUBLIC OFFLS:** (Constitutional Amendment) Prohibits membership of certain part-time public officials in public retirement systems

HB 331 – Foil **RETIREMENT/TEACHERS:** Relative to the Teachers' Retirement System of La., allows a member in the optional retirement plan to make a one-time, irrevocable election to transfer to the defined benefit plan

HB 392 – Hardy **RETIREMENT/STATE-STWIDE:** Relative to state and statewide retirement systems, prohibits certain members who are reemployed after retirement from receiving retirement benefits or accruing additional benefits

HB 453 – Robideaux **RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS:** Relative to the La. State Employees' Retirement System, establishes the Hazardous Duty Services

HB 493 – Connick **PUBLIC SFTY/DEPARTMENT:** Transfers the Crescent City Connection police from DOTD to DPS&C

HB 515 – Pearson **RETIREMENT SYSTEMS:** Provides for the organization, governance, administration, and membership of the Funding Review Panel

HB 516 – Arnold **RETIREMENT/STATE SYSTEMS:** Makes permanent certain requirements that state retirement systems direct portions of certain types of investments through La. broker-dealers

HB 517 – Robideaux **RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS:** Relative to the La. State Employees' Retirement System, provides for the employee contribution rate of certain members

HB 518 – Robideaux **RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS:** Relative to the La. State Employees' Retirement System, clarifies the definition of "accumulated contributions"

HB 519 – Cortez **RETIREMENT/TEACHERS:** Provides relative to the Teachers' Retirement System of La. and provides relative to rehired retirees

HB 536 – Hardy **HOUSING/AUTHORITIES:** Provides relative to the governing board of the Opelousas Housing Authority

HB 600 – Harrison **GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION:** Abolishes the Department of Health and Hospitals and the Department of Social Services and creates the Department of Health and Social Services

HB 658 – Ritchie **RETIREMENT/TEACHERS:** Requires membership in the Teacher's Retirement System of Louisiana (TRSL) for charter school teachers

HB 662 – Pope **RETIREMENT/SCHOOL EMPS:** Relative to the La. School Employees' Retirement System, allows for a reverse transfer of service credit from the Teachers' Retirement System of La.

HB 665 – R. Jones	ADMIN LAW/DIVISION: Requires the departments of health and hospitals, social services, and education to delegate certain hearing and adjudication functions to the division of administrative la
HB 734 – Pearson	ETHICS/CODE: Provides for the not-for-profit organizations or funds within such organizations which may give donations to certain public employees affected by certain hurricanes, the time period during which public employees may accept contributions, and the deadline by which organizations must report such donations to the Board of Ethics
HB 739 – Hoffman	TEACHERS: Provides relative to the employment as a full-time teacher of a member of the Teachers' Retirement System of La. who is retired
HB 743 – Henry	LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR: (Constitutional Amendment) Abolishes the office of lieutenant governor, transfers duties to secretary of state, provides for filling vacancies in office of secretary of state and governor
HB 746 – Robideaux	RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS: Relative to the La. State Employees' Retirement System, provides relative to calculation of benefits for persons electing early retirement
HB 747 – Arnold	RETIREMENT/LOCAL: Relative to the Harbor Police Retirement System (Port of New Orleans), provides that persons retired from other systems are eligible for membership from their date of hire
HB 748 – Pearson	RETIREMENT/CONTRIBUTIONS: Relative to the La. State Employees' Retirement System, requires employers to remit to the system individualized employer contributions
HR 758 – Hutter	ETHICS: Requires the Board of Ethics to make available the name of a complainant under certain circumstances
HB 783 – Harrison	RETIREMENT/TEACHERS: Relative to the Teachers' Retirement System of La. (TRSL), provides with respect to unused annual and sick leave
HB 784 – St. Germain	RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS: Relative to the La. State Employees' Retirement System, provides for benefit enhancements for certain employees within DPS&C, office of the state fire marshal
HB 812 – Henry	LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR: Abolishes office of lieutenant governor and Dept. of Culture, Recreation and Tourism and transfers powers, duties, and agencies to executive branch departments
HB 891 – Lambert	ENVIRONMENT/QUALITY DEPT: Provides for the organization of the Dept. of Environmental Quality
HB 900 – Gallot	POLICE/STATE: Transfers capitol police to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections
HB 930 – Tucker	RETIREMENT/STATE SYSTEMS: Relative to state retirement systems, establishes a defined contribution plan for new hires\
HB 931 – Tucker	RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS: (Constitutional Amendment) Relative to state retirement systems, permits the legislature to establish a defined contribution plan for new hires

HB 958 – Ligi **RETIREMENT BENEFITS:** Relative to La. public retirement systems, provides for limitations on average compensation upon which a retiree's benefits are calculated

HB 1077 – J.H. Smith **ADMIN LAW/DIVISION:** Provides that the director of the division of administrative law is appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court instead of the governor

HB 1103 – Tucker **RETIREMENT/STATE SYSTEMS:** Relative to state retirement systems, makes changes to the benefits of persons hired on or after July 1, 2010

HB 1142 – Robideaux **RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS:** Relative to the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System, provides for compliance with qualified plan provisions of the Internal Revenue Code

HB 1143 – Gallot **ETHICS/BOARD:** Amends provisions concerning enforcement of the ethics code

HB 1178 – Connick **ETHICS/BOARD:** Provides relative to the Ethics Adjudicatory Board

HB 1179 – Ligi **ETHICS/BOARD:** Provides relative to decisions of the Board of Ethics and of the Ethics Adjudicatory Board

HB 1198 – Katz **SOCIAL SERVICES DEPT:** Provides for the transfer of functions of Louisiana Rehabilitation Services from the Department of Social Services to the Louisiana Workforce Commission and the Department of Health and Hospitals.

HB 1202 – Gallot **ETHICS/CODE:** Provides relative to appeals of decisions enforcing laws within the jurisdiction of the Board of Ethics

HB 1229 – Tucker **RETIREMENT/STATE SYSTEMS:** Creates the State Retirement System Investment Committee and consolidates investment duties of the four state retirement systems into such commission

- HB 262 – Gallot **SUNSET LAW** - Re-creates the Department of State Civil Service
- HB 302 – Smiley **BOARDS/COMMISSIONS:** Provides relative to disclosure of information concerning certain boards and commissions
- HB 381 – Montoucet **CIVIL SERVICE/FIRE & POL** - Provides relative to the political activities of employees of the municipal fire and police civil service
- HB 384 – Montoucet **CIVIL SERVICE/FIRE & POL** - Provides relative to the political activities of employees of the municipal fire and police civil service
- HB 567 – Abramson **CONSTITUTION/AMENDMENT:** Provides relative to a constitutional convention
- HB 629 – Danahay **GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION:** Transfers responsibility for certain state employee training programs to the Department of State Civil Service from the division of administration
- HB 727 – Hoffman **CIVIL SERVICE/FIRE & POL:** Provides relative to the establishment and maintenance of promotional employment lists for the classified police service
- HB 752 – Schroder **CIVIL SERVICE:(Constitutional Amendment)** Grants the legislature sole authority to provide for pay increases for persons in state service
- HB 753 – Schroder **CIVIL SERVICE/STATE:(Constitutional Amendment)** Abolishes the State Civil Service Commission and the Department of State Civil Service effective January 9, 2012
- HB 754 – Schroder **CIVIL SERVICE:(Constitutional Amendment)** Prohibits pay increases to persons in state service when there is a budget deficit
- HB 755 – Schroder **CIVIL SERVICE:(Constitutional Amendment)** Requires the legislature to determine prior to each fiscal year if a pay increase may be granted to persons in state service and if so, the manner and amount of the increase
- HB 757 – Schroder **CIVIL SERVICE:** Provides relative to certain required reports regarding employees to the Dept. of State Civil Service and further requires those reports to be sent to the presiding officers of the legislature
